January at P&G. Over 150 attorneys and community partners attended and heard Ohio Supreme Court Chief Justice Maureen O'Connor speak about the importance of pro bono service. Check out photos of the <u>Launch Celebration</u>.

Thanks to Justice O'Connor's leadership and the advocacy work done by many local attorneys, the Ohio Supreme Court recently passed an amendment to the corporate status rule that now expands the license of corporate status attorneys and allows them to volunteer on behalf of approved pro bono organizations like PBP-GC. We have already connected several corporate status attorneys with nonprofits and always welcome new volunteers! Read more about the rule change here.

We also recently hosted our first Nonprofit Legal Check-Up with attorneys from Dinsmore & Shohl and the Association of Corporate Counsel on May 19th. Teams of attorneys met with 7 nonprofit organizations to assess the legal health of their organizations and to help spot potential legal issues before they turn into real problems.
