Queen City Book Bank

Since 1986, the Literacy Network of Greater Cincinnati has worked diligently to connect children and adults to programs and resources they need to become strong readers. As the educational needs of the community changed throughout the years, they worked to listen to those needs and adjusted their programming. In this past year, the Literacy Network officially became the Queen City Book Bank (QCBB) to serve as a regional book bank. In their new location, QCBB serves as a literacy hub by providing curated free book distribution, tutoring for children and adults, Little Free Libraries, and community outreach and educational support initiatives.
