All pro bono work performed in 2022, whether or not the matter is complete, must be submitted in the 2022 reporting cycle to receive CLE credit. CLE credit requests are due no later than January 13, 2023, to Chasity Paul, PBPO Paralegal.



They are a team of volunteers, ranging from engineers, inventors, woodworkers, seamstresses, occupational therapists and more, whose skill sets come together to design, build and deliver custom devices at no cost to hundreds of recipients every year.

"In the last four years, May We Help has grown from one program to four, and the number of people we serve has grown fivefold. Plus, we added a commercialization arm to further increase the number of people we can reach with the solutions our volunteers create.
